Failure to comply with this directive from the Provincial Health Officer may result in a golf course's ability to stay open. It may open Zone directors to personal liability as we have received advice insurance policies we carry with respect to Directors and Officers will not cover any claims made if something were to incur.

For the foreseeable future we should all be happy we can play and enjoy golf at our home courses.”
